Why were the Designs Updated?




- The most recent series of notes featuring the monarch went into circulation in 1990; <u>35 years ago</u>.
- Currency designs are usually updated every 7-10 years to deter counterfeiting and keep up with advancements in currency design. Belize's currency exceeded this lifespan.
- The passing or Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in 2022 prompted a review of the currency design.
- The new banknotes celebrate Belize's cultural heritage by honoring the two recipients of Belize's highest honor, "Order of the National Hero".



Belize's New Banknotes: Key Characteristics

All banknotes contain:

- Central Bank of Belize title
- Denomination
- Legal tender statement
- Signatures
- Serial numbers
- Front National hero
- Reverse Unique Themes
- National symbols
- Unique color









What Remains the Same?

Color Scheme

New notes follows a similar color scheme as the previous series.

Size of Notes

Notes are the same size as previous series:

- **150mm x 75mm** for the \$100 and \$50
- **140mm x 70mm** for the \$20, \$10, \$5, and \$2 notes.

Material

Notes are made from the same material as previous series (cotton substrate)

Value

Notes maintain the same value (pegged BZ\$2 to USD \$1)

What Features are New?

Some new features include:

Tactile Marks

New feature introduced to help the visually impaired distinguish denominations

Advanced Security Threads

New, color-shifting threads introduced.

Holographic Foil Stripes

New feature introduced to the \$10,\$20,\$50,\$100

UV Features

New, updated UV features on all denominations











Handling Your New Banknotes

- New banknotes may feel slightly different to previous series due to the design but can be handled just as easily.
- Always check and count carefully when giving or receiving banknotes
- Please treat your banknotes with respect –
 Don't tear, staple or write on your banknotes!
- Intentionally damaging/mutilating currency is a criminal offence under the Belize Criminal Code and may result in a fine.









Authenticating Your New Banknotes

Top tips:

Look closely at the banknote

- Hold up to the light
- Look for the watermark
- Hide and reveal numeral
- Crisp, clear printing

Feel the banknote

- Cotton paper feels different to commercial wood paper
- Raised print
- Tactile features

Tilt and move the banknote around

- Security threads with colour changing effects and movement
- Holographic stripes on high denominations

Check the banknotes carefully

 Use UV lamps and magnifying lenses wherever possible

Compare with a banknote you know to be genuine

 light the image completes in perfect
 register

- Raised Print Run your fingers over the portrait and text on the front of the note.
 The text should feel raised against the surface

Tilt - The below features can be seen when tilted:

- LIFT: Tilt the banknote to see the denomination numeral only visible when viewed at an oblique angle
- Pure Image thread:
 - Tilt the banknote to see the pulsating movement of the Orchid
 - The numeral denomination rainbows in colour when tilted.

- UV light Areas of the note light up in distinctly different colours when viewed under UV light.

Theme: Historical buildings of Belize

Front:

- Portrait: Rt. Hon. George Cadle Price
- National Assembly Building
- Belize City Supreme Court in Security
 Thread

Back:

- Belize City Peninsula and Haulover Creek,
- Supreme Court Building, Belize City
- St. John's Cathedral, Belize City
- Map of Belize

- See-through feature The banknote





Front:

- Portrait: Hon. Philip Goldson
- Green Heron
- Scarlet Macaw & Keel-Billed Toucan on holographic stripe

Back

- Keel-Billed Toucan
- Long-Billed Hermit Hummingbird
- Scaly-Breasted Hummingbird
- Keel-Billed Toucan in security thread

\$10 - Tilt

- Security thread: Turn to the reverse and tilt the banknote to see the colour changing security thread.
- The colour changes from Green to Red and you will see a pulsing effect to the Keel-Billed Toucan alongside the 10 numeral

- Microtext Using a magnifier look for the microtext
- UV light Areas of the note light up in distinctly different colours when viewed under UV light.

Predominant colour: Yellow/orange

Theme: Belize's jungle life

Front:

- Portrait: Rt. Hon. George Cadle Price
- Baird's Tapir
- Blue Morpho Butterfly on holographic stripe

Back:

- Jaguar
- Green Iguana
- Jaguar in security thread
- Map of Belize





\$20: Security Features

<u>Look</u> - The below features can be seen with the naked eyes

- Watermark and Electrotype Hold the note up to the light to reveal the portrait watermark. The highlight numeral will correspond to the value of the banknote.
- See-through feature The banknote
 denomination and Mayan numeral are
 printed half on the front and half on the
 back. When you hold the note up to the
 light the image completes in perfect register









\$20 - Tilt

- Security thread: Turn to the reverse and tilt the banknote to see the colour changing security thread.
- The colour changes from Green to Red and you will see a pulsing effect to the Jaguar head alongside the 20 numeral.





Predominant colour: Pink/purple

Theme: Archaeological attractions of Belize

Front:

- Portrait: Hon. Philip Goldson
- Mask Temple, Lamanai
- Mask Temple, Lamanai in holographic stripe

Back:

- Top of Caana, Caracol
- Xunantunich Maya Ruin
- Segment of the Xunantunich West Frieze
- Mayan mask image in security thread
- Map of Belize

- Watermark and Electrotype Hold the note up to the light to reveal the portrait watermark. The highlight numeral will correspond to the value of the banknote.
- See-through feature The banknote
 denomination and Mayan numeral are
 printed half on the front and half on the
 back. When you hold the note up to the
 light the image completes in perfect
 register

Predominant colour: Blue

Theme: Marine attractions & aquatic life of Belize

Front:

Portrait: Rt. Hon. George Cadle Price

- Queen Triggerfish
- Hawksbill Sea Turtle on holographic stripe

Back:

- Hawksbill Sea Turtle
- Great Blue Hole image
- Nurse Shark with pair of French Angelfish
- Grooved Brain Coral
- Long snout/Slender Seahorse in security thread
- Map of Belize





\$100: Security Features

Look - The below features can be seen with the naked eyes

- Watermark and Electrotype Hold the note up to the light to reveal the portrait watermark. The highlight numeral will correspond to the value of the banknote.
- See-through feature The banknote
 denomination and Mayan numeral are
 printed half on the front and half on the
 back. When you hold the note up to the
 light the image completes in perfect register










\$100 - Tilt

- Security thread: Turn to the reverse and tilt the banknote to see the colour changing security thread.
- The colour changes from Green to Blue and you will see a pulsing effect to the Seahorse alongside the 100 numeral.





Check - The below features can be checked with a tool:

- Microtext Using a magnifier look for the microtext reading
- UV light Areas of the note light up in distinctly different colours when viewed under UV light.











Final Word

- Counterfeiting is a permanent threat, but prominent security features assist in early detection of counterfeits.
- If you receive a note you suspect to be counterfeit pass it immediately to your superiors at work, or to the Police
- Remember it is illegal to use or pass on counterfeits!
